Turbotville Community Hall 2026 Renovation Project The Board of Directors of the Turbotville Community Hall Corporation is pleased to announce the receipt of a \$7,850.00 grant from the Ralph and Josephine Smith Fund at First Community Foundation Partnership of Pennsylvania (FCFP). These funds are designated for the Turbotville Community Hall Corporation's 2026 renovation project for the 429-seat auditorium in the Turbotville Community Hall.

The auditorium project includes replacement of 14 of the original (1922) pressed tin ceiling tiles and then painting the entire ceiling, walls, window trim, and doors. Also included in this project is painting the ceiling and walls of the stage area.

The contractor for this project is Lance Ricci, Creative Homes & Painting-Williamsport.

Turbotville Community Hall Corporation's goal is the complete renovation of the Turbotville Community Hall, which was built in 1922 in honor and memory of the men from the area who served our country during World War I.
